

Key Facts about the Catholic Church in Lithuania

- 2 ecclesiastical provinces - Vilnius and Kaunas,
- 1 cardinal – Audrys Juozas Bačkis, the archbishop emeritus of Vilnius,
- 7 dioceses, of which two are archdioceses - Vilnius and Kaunas. Other dioceses: Kaišiadorys, Panevėžys, Šiauliai, Telšiai and Vilkaviškis. There is also the military ordinariate, which provides pastoral services to Catholic soldiers and civilians working in military institutions and is equal to a diocese in status;
- 55 deaneries,
- 708 parishes,
- 1025 churches and chapels, including those affiliated and unaffiliated with parishes,
- 862 priests,
- 17 ordained bishops: 2 archbishops, 5 bishops, 3 auxiliary bishops, 2 archbishops emeritus, and 5 bishops emeritus,
- 10 private Catholic schools and 13 public Catholic-leaning schools, 9 Catholic-leaning elementary and pre-schools,
- 33 Catholic organizations, communities, and movements (not including their branches, departments, or missions),
- 10 Catholic museums and cultural centers,
- 8 care institutions, charities, and charity foundations
- 3 seminaries in Vilnius, Kaunas, and Telšiai. 53 seminarians have studied since autumn of 2018: 5 in Telšiai, 29 in Vilnius, and 19 in Kaunas.
- 13 monasteries, of which 1 contemplative congregation, totaling 148 monks,
- 41 convents, of which 8 contemplative congregations, totaling 602 religious sisters,
- During the 2011 Lithuanian Census, 2,350,478 Lithuanians identified as members of the Roman Catholic religious community, accounting for 77.23% of Lithuania's residents;
- The Church in Lithuania baptizes about 27 thousand children per year,
- About 8 thousands couples are married in the Church per year.
